Each issue focuses on a special topic but may also include a *Varia* section, which contains articles unrelated to it. A book review section keeps readers informed of locally and internationally published books in the humanities and social sciences. Individual issues may include interviews with eminent writers, scholars, and social scientists, as well as forums on key developments in the disciplines covered by the journal.

VTU Review considers all submitted manuscripts on the condition that

• the manuscript has been submitted only to *VTU Review*; it is not under consideration, or accepted for publication, or in press, or published elsewhere;

• the manuscript contains nothing that is abusive, defamatory, obscene, fraudulent, or illegal.

In addition to the articles on the journal's special topic, two more critical texts and a companion poem are included under the heading "Letters."
